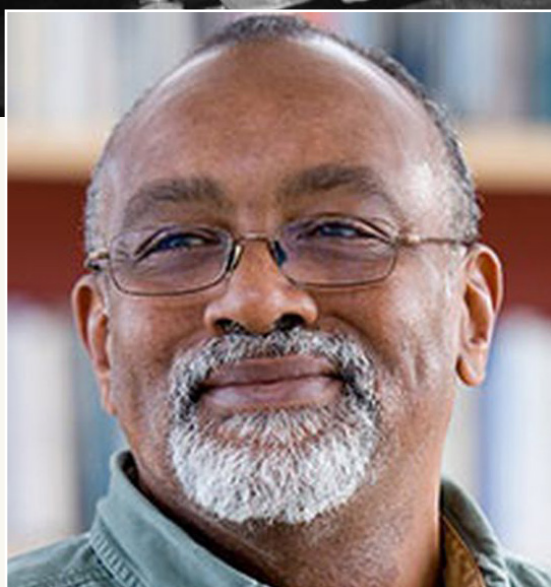


The '60s at 50: Reflections on America *a Half Century Later*
